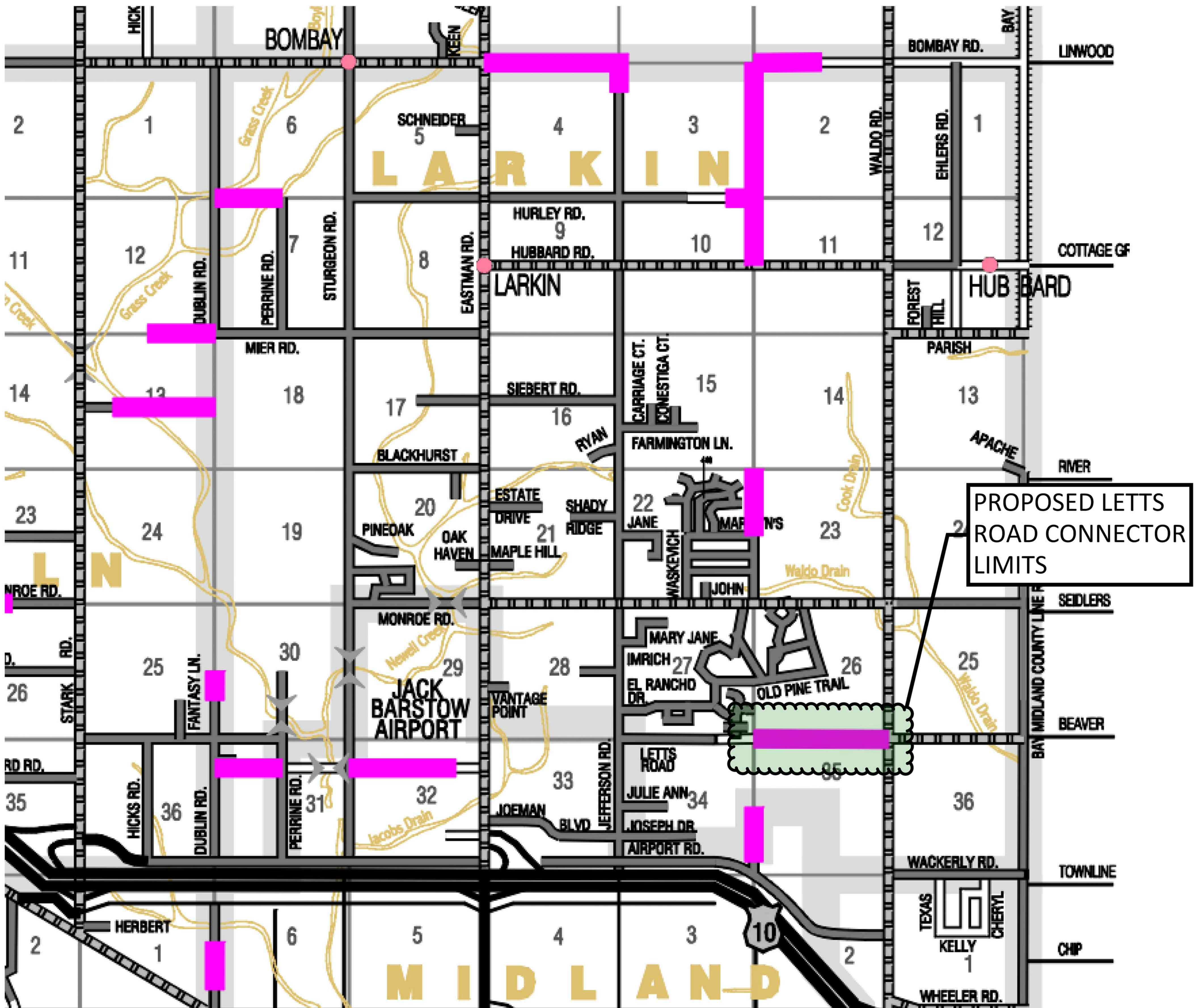


MIDLAND COUNTY ROAD COMMISSION McNITT RIGHT-OF-WAY

McNitt Right-of-Way

Prior to 1932, many county roads were owned by each respective Township. In 1931 the McNitt Act was passed (Public Act 130 of 1931). This act brought major reform in local road administration and funding. With the passage of the McNitt Act, 1,269 township roads were placed under the jurisdiction of their respective County Road Commissions. Thus, the county road system went from 17,000 miles to 85,000 miles. In 1939, this act was amended to include mileage of streets and alleys in recorded plats of unincorporated subdivisions of the county road systems. The McNitt Act remained on the statute books until it was incorporated into Public Act 51 of 1951.

Letts Road, between Waldo Road and Jefferson Road, was accepted by Midland County Road Commission on February 24, 1934.



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
