### Miscellaneous:

Discussion was held on staffing. Currently we have three temporary employees on the road crew working 40 hours per week. Sam presented the new snow route map that will equalize miles for each driver and improve the response time. We will need three employees to fill winter snow plow routes. Hiring three full time employees will fill the vacancies and eliminate the need for temporary drivers.

Utility corridors were discussed. Utility companies want to install major towers within the right of way. We have taken Washtenaw County Road Commission Procedures and Regulations and modified them.

Moved by Commissioner Atton and seconded by Commissioner Terwillegar adopt the Procedures and Regulations for Developing Public Roads and the Procedures and Regulations for Permit Activities.

The county drain along 11 Mile Road, between County Line and Redstone Road, in Porter Township was discussed. Ditches are very deep and Porter Township Supervisor Bob Fleming would like to get them filled in. Drain Commission does not have the available funding. Sam presented quotes for approximately \$88,000 and \$124,500 to fill in the ditches. Discussion was held and there are many deep ditches throughout the county and funding is not available to fill them all in. Terry will look into possible safety grants.

Terry gave board an update on the large crack on the rail trail. He has talked with Craig from OHM. They determined is was due to the clay underneath drying out.

## **Staff Reports:**

Art stated they will be stressing the Castor Road bridge with the new machine Ben built and it will be opened today.

He is closing out the 2016 federal projects and starting to work on surveys for next year's projects.

Ben gave the Board a demonstration on the new "green lights" that he will begin to install on new tucks, one on the top of the truck, two on the back and two in the front.

Russ stated he is working on a letter for a resident in Larkin Township on the Perrine Road culde-sac. The property owner would like sell a parcel of land. Russ has researched the right-ofway and verified that the deed was filed with the register of deeds office. Russ also discussed Graebner Court in Ingersoll Township. A private road name permit was issued by the Road Commission a year ago. It is a private road and the road commission has no jurisdiction.

Terry stated he has compared the condition of large culverts around the county that are now 10 years old. He compared poly coat, aluminized steel and galvanized steel and determined the aluminized steel is performing the best and can be purchased at the same price as galvanized steel.

Don discussed the condition of 8 Mile Road off Shepherd Road in Porter Township. Water floods over the roadway for approximately 1 mile. Sam explained there are no ditches to drain the water. School busses must use this route. Sam will look into drainage and possibly installing a large culvert.
