- I believe extending Letts road would be an issue as traffic flow is already heavy on Letts. Few people know how to navigate the intersection at Jefferson and Letts/Commerce, and people /wildlife are constantly on/in the roadways. Letts is nice as a dead-end.
- Letts Road is just fine the way it is. Please stop trying to push this through for someone to build a subdivision.
- Would love this as an additional route over to Jefferson from Waldo. The left turn on to Monroe from Waldo with the new roundabout is quite scary now if someone is coming southbound.

- I can't believe this idea is even being entertained. A roundabout had to be installed at Monroe due to "safety issues" and now you want to create an almost identical situation a mile south? No road is needed here. Stop destroying people's peace & privacy. Stop ruining property value. Stop endangering people in their own yards for whatever incentive you all are receiving. This is insane. People live in the county for privacy and peace and you know what? We asked about this when we bought this place and when we chose to put a new home here. "Oh, you'll never see that in your lifetime." What in the world is going on here? I am terrified for my children's safety if this plan moves forward. For myself as I now have no privacy & have to come up with money to fence & barricade part of an acre lot. This is ridiculous! Feel free to reach out by email or phone because I have no problems discussing my concerns. Compromising safety is not the right answer where traffic congestion does not exist.
- If this will increase my taxes, I'm against this connector.
- Utilize roundabout so we do not have the same type of safety issues that the Monroe intersection previously had.
 - o How much traffic would this add to Waldo?
- Would be useful to use Letts between Jefferson & Waldo!
- Need street light on Jefferson Letts
- There are species of turtles Blandings in the proposed area that are under special concern in Michigan and are considered threatened in other states. There are wetlands areas that need to be truly protected in the area. They're multiple other routes in and out of Waldo Eastman and the Jefferson corridor that commuters can take to avoid any upticks of traffic, this is not a critical connection. Let's put things in perspective and realize this is not true traffic like other cities. Being stopped by a light two times before proceeding is considered traffic in Midland. I would rather see funds put towards bike routes extensions of shoulders, improvements to road conditions- materials or improvements to take yard waste bins similar to the City of Midland. The funds could be used to improve the greater Larkin County in a more beneficial way to support the greater population other than an unnecessary extension through a highly intensive nature area. Please do consider other options!
- We would not like a road through because the noise is enough and I feel like it won't take much to go just to monroe then waldo, it also keeps the neighborhood quiet.
- This survey is written poorly. These are leading questions, and the answers are leading answers. This is highly disappointing if you are truly looking for honest feedback. Based on the time scheduled for the first meeting, it does not appear that you are looking for honest feedback, and instead trying to push this through without adequate public comment.
 - No one has articulated what problem we are trying to solve here. Why destroy a beautiful area and desired neighborhood when there isn't a necessary reason?
 - I am completely against the Letts Road extension and neighbors have already looked into legal action if the extension is recommended.

- Have you ever seen all the people riding bikes on Letts? A large portion being kids and teenagers. This was my only way to get anywhere before I could drive.
 - The road would be completely unsafe if you put in the extension. Let us have our neighborhood remain a safe place for us!
- Please advise as to who is asking for this and how it provides any real benefit to the homeowners on letts and the adjoining neighborhoods. We are not growing as a community and this is a horrible idea from a safety and property value perspective.
- Although this would be a nice shortcut, the cons far outweigh the pros. I feel there would be many accidents on Waldo and E Letts. Also much more traffic on E Letts. I DO NOT want to pay for it at all in any way!
- I think tho would be a great addition! The traffic I experience on El Rancho would definitely not be as heavy (or FAST!!) and driving to the other end of Midland would be exponentially easier taking Waldo as opposed to Eastman or Washington.
- I see no benefit for this project. Joe Mann's blvd is not busy at all no matter what time of day it is. I don't see a need. I think this is a waste of tax payers money and would destroy the beauty that makes this area unique. This would encourage high speed drivers and increased accidents. It would cause house values to decrease. It would put our children at risk as well as any other active adult at risk of injury from high speed drivers. The environs mental impact would be devastating. I would be highly disappointed if this decision goes thru. I can't believe anyone would feel this is necessary and would spend the money to do it. It's ludicrous. The money should be spent on other needs of the community and not be wasted.
- This connection would significantly impact the neighborhoods in this region and the safety of our children and families with increased traffic both on Letts and through our neighborhood, and increased speeding vehicles.
- I believe it would be a waste of money to connect Letts. I would rather see more roundabouts put in or more sidewalks on current roads.
- There is no need for the letts connection and would only create a dangerous situation for the many residents in this area with the increased traffic (to include large trucks) at what is likely to be high speeds. There are numerous people and animals (deer & turkey) that regular walk along and on letts rd off Jefferson. By opening a connector, there would inevitably be a steady stream of traffic putting people and animals at constant risk. I really do not see the need for a connector here and have never heard any resident of midland complain about not having East- west connectors. This seems a great waste of time, money and resources that could be better utilized elsewhere in the city and county.

- As a resident in the Pine Hollow Subdivision, I am against this project and do not see a need for it. I have many questions that were not able to be answered at the open house on 9/12/23. Including...what traffic controls will be placed at the intersection of Jefferson and Letts? What is the projected traffic increase for Letts? What will the speed limit on Letts be? Are there weight restrictions? What will happen to the protected wildlife, including the Blandings Turtle that has been found there?
 - I was told that the projected time frame is from 2029-2036. Is that true? Seven to thirteen years from now??
 - There also needs to be a night time open house as many, many of the residents work during the day.
- I am extremely concerned with speeds. People regularly walk with families on Letts. We
 have asked for reduced speed signs and those requests have repeatedly been ignored.
 Letts Road is dangerous for pedestrians, and officials don't understand this is a
 neighborhood with children, pets, bicycles, and a lot of foot traffic. The extension will only
 add to these concerns.
 - Also, part of the reason we moved to our location is because our road was part of the Midland Urban Growth Area. With the idea of slowing urban growth, it seems the Letts Rd project is only going to assist in the growth of Midland. Not to mention, some of the land along the extension is owned by developers, so how long before we have new neighborhoods being built to increase the congestion the extension is supposed to relieve? And how long before we will be annexed into the city?
- I don't see any benefit to people in this neighborhood as far as "better" access to east west travel. The proposed road would add more noise and higher invents of speeding on Letts and endanger walkers and wildlife.
 - Perhaps the township would like the access so new home builds may add tax revenue but I do not feel this is worth the cost in money or in how it would change the character of the neighborhood.
- This would be a poor use of resources. Monroe and diamond/Joe Mann are both perfect
 ways to access points. This is unnecessary and would have vast implications and would
 result in a devaluation of morel court and pine hallow estates. The reason people buy

- I can't express enough that I do NOT want this project. I live on this street and this project would mean a large increase of vehicle traffic directly near my residence, among other issues. I would not have moved into my current house if it was adjacent to a major through road. This would be horrible for my local community.
- this is an awful idea and use of resources.
- I am very opposed to the extension of Letts. It is a huge expense that is just not needed. There is plenty of access going east/west on the existing roads. It will make the area less safe for kids and pedestrians due to the increased traffic.

- There is amazing wildlife that could be negatively impacted by more traffic on Letts-Owls, foxes, hawks, turkeys, deer, blue birds, cranes, geese, etc,etc.
 - I don't see any point of doing the extension without Waldo road access to US 10, and that Waldo Road access should come first.
- I would very much like a west bound exit ramp from US-10 onto Waldo.
- This would disrupt not only the community but also the wildlife! So awful!
- Please do not do this. It's a main reason we all live back here. Lack of traffic.
- I have grandchildren who live on Letts Rd. The cars go too fast there now, a through road would only be worse.
- There is predominantly single family residential being developed on the portion of Letts
 just east of Jefferson. The proposed extension of Letts will likely bring high speed
 through traffic into the area. Not good for families. There are plenty of ways to get to
 Midland. Spend the money elsewhere.
- This is completely unnecessary. I am a retired military spouse and have lived all over the United States and abroad. One of the reasons we moved to Midland a year ago is because there is no traffic! We chose Larkin Township and live on Rolling Ridge Dr because we were seeking peace and quiet. Please leave Letts a quiet dead end.
- The development of this road is a horrible idea, with negative impact on those who will have to put up with increase in traffic. There is not a large enough traffic volume to even remotely justify the expense that will no doubt be passed on to property owners.
- I think there are much better uses for the money.
 - o Dividing the forest with a connector would have significant impact on wildlife.
 - With the already existing connector on Monroe I truly don't see the need for this additional one on Letts.
- Regarding the question on access to I-75, I use Letts/Beaver and US-10 about equally.
 - As this road will probably not be serving an area with a high NMT demand, I am not sure that the opportunities for NMT enhancement will mean much. However, if the property on the sides of Letts is developed into housing, then the NMT opportunities would be meaningful. The problem is then how does that connect. Jefferson is not a good NMT route. Improvements in NMT to the mall would be useful
 - As Monroe/Waldo was converted to a roundabout, consider a roundabout at Letts/Waldo.
- As a resident of Pine Hollow we are opposed to Letts road connecting. We purchased
 property here to ensure our kids have a safe, quiet place to play. We open the windows
 at night to listen to the wildlife. A road would change all of this and create an
 unnecessary thoroughfare through this quiet neighborhood. Please consider the voice
 of the people most impacted in this decision the Pine Hollow Residents. Thank you.
- I see no benefit to this connection. This road will decrease property values & safety. There have to be more beneficial road projects where our tax dollars can be put to better use rather than putting in this connection. No local residents want or need this.

- Seems like a Letts/Waldo interchange would have similar issues to the recently upgraded Monroe/Waldo interchange.
 - Monroe and Joseph/Diamond seem to be adequate east/west roads without adding additional connector at Letts.
 - Letts east of Jefferson currently has significant deer population. One ran into the side of my daughter's car this spring and produced significant damage to the vehicle. With all the wooded area along the proposed connector, this new section would likely have more issues than the current section east of Jefferson.
- I live at 3879 E Letts and strongly appose this proposed corridor from the north side of Midland to Beaver road and access to I 75. We already have speed issues and traffic concerns we could not get previously addressed like reducing the speed.
- I live in the subdivisions off of Letts east of Jefferson, and I moved there in part because of the seclusion. I would prefer to have slightly more traffic than to lose the quiet of the area. Many children ride and play in that area, and I hate the idea of Letts now becoming a high-speed, high-traffic area.
- This Letts Road extension is not needed, not wanted, and is a waste of public spending. If the City of Midland wants it, let them pay for it. I am not influenced by this extension being a part of the City of Midland Master Plan. I am very concerned that there is an assumption of need here. In living here for 30 years, I have never once heard anyone ask for the Letts Road extension. I see this Letts Road extension becoming nothing but a drag strip. There are many more projects that are more worthy of completion than the Letts Road extension. Paving Bombay Road would be a better use of funds.
- I addressed the extension 15 years ago (with the Larkin Planner) and was told ""It is not
 in our 5-year plan"". My thoughts were to relieve the traffic on Eastman thru Jefferson to
 Letts!!
- Would love to have an exit ramp before Eastman Road on Waldo to ease congestion on Eastman.
- Not safe or to busy for walking or riding anything.
- The connected road would cause many problems. For instance, many people would no longer be able to walk or ride there bikes down that road because it would be very dangerous. Also, it would not be as peaceful as it is now and it would disrupt most of the animals. There will be more traffic and it would take longer to get in and out of the neighborhood. To add on to that, if there is more traffic it could cause more accidents. Although, not only people coild get in accidents, but if the road becomes busier, and people are going faster, the animals in our neighborhood (turkeys, deer, etc.) are at a higher risk of getting injured or worse. These are just some of the bad things that are caused by the connecting road and I think it is a very and idea.

 investigator?
- Please hear our voice as the community members that will be negatively impacted by and see no benefit in moving this project forward. We do not want this road!
- This is not appropriate and a waste of our taxpayers dollars by the Township. I am against ANY extension to the road.
- The other East/west roads are not at capacity and the value vs what would be spent is not there in addition to the negative impact to the neighborhood.
- Better east west access if there are any issues on Monroe or Diamond drive.
- This adds very little value to the community and would negatively impact protected wildlife and several neighborhoods. If you want to improve traffic flow in the area build a roundabout at the corner of Jefferson and Letts.
- Again, this roadway extension is not necessary and the traffic data proves it. This is a

- Please do not build the Letts road connector. I live by Letts on the Jefferson side, and I find great value to be added by not having it connected all the way through. Families can used Letts for recreational activities without worry. Building the connector will threaten the saftey of this area because of increased speeds, decreased attention, and less personal responsibility for actions taken on this road by people who do not live in those connected neighborhoods. Children are able to ride bikes, walk dogs, and drive golf carts freely without concern for their own safety. Not having a connection to Waldo keeps our children safe and allows them to act like kids. Increased traffic because of this proposal will pose a danger to our families.
 - I never experience traffic on my way to or from my house to Waldo. I am uninterested with creating additional traffic flow options since I don't think traffic is a viable reason to build. Please do not continue with this project.
 - CRITICAL Shouldn't traffic data be collected at the intersection of E Letts and Jefferson, including wait times? And also at the Diamond Drive - Waldo intersection. I don't see red circles at these two intersections?
 - o Would someone contact me via a phone call or email to answer this question?
 - DIDN'T ANSWER VERY FIRST QUESTION: I see both advantages and disadvantages of the proposed E Letts extension. I'd like to see the study results and cost before stating whether I favor or disfavor the project. Given where I live, it would provide a personal benefit to reduce travel times. BUT, I am concerned about impact on traffic at the E Letts and Jefferson intersection.
- Who is pushing this change?? No one in the neighborhood wants this! There are other areas in Midland that desperately need change, ex. the intersection at Wackerly and Jefferson!! This seems like it is being considered for someones individual gain rather than for the good of the public!
- The current houses on Letts Road east of Jefferson are designed to be on a small city street and it would not be fair to those houses now to have a through road with high traffic after the fact.
 - Letts road in this same section is far too narrow to accommodate any new traffic and would need to be widened significantly if this project goes forward. As it is in the winter it is almost too narrow for two SUVs to pass on icy sections. Widening the existing sections of Letts (east of Jefferson) needs to be added to the budget and scope of any project extending Letts eastward.
 - There are many horrible roads in Midland County. My biggest issue with this project is that traffic patterns will not change much and we will spend money on a road that isn't needed versus fixing our existing roads. Since moving to Midland I've had to have the bearings fixed on a newer car for the first time in my life because of the bumpy roads (commerce for example). Let's get all our roads up to date first.

 - current residential properties on Letts and the adjacent neighborhoods will be devalued!

- Please understand how much of a significant concern this is for our neighborhood. The
